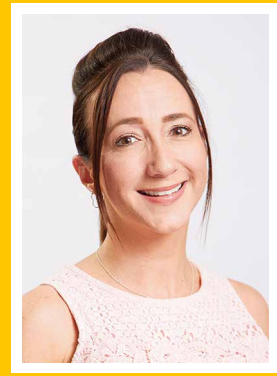

Our Uniform

All students from Years 7-11 are expected to wear the Hessele uniform.

- **Blazer:** black with school logo



- **Skirt:** plain black knee length flared, pleated or A line

- **Trousers:** plain black, full length, waist high, tailored



Indoor PE Kit

House colour and royal blue panelled polo shirt with school logo. Royal blue shorts. White socks. No outdoor shoes to be worn for indoor activities.



- **Shirt:** plain white, loose fitting

- **House tie:** must be worn with six visible stripes

- **Shoes:** plain black, leather or leather look, polishable



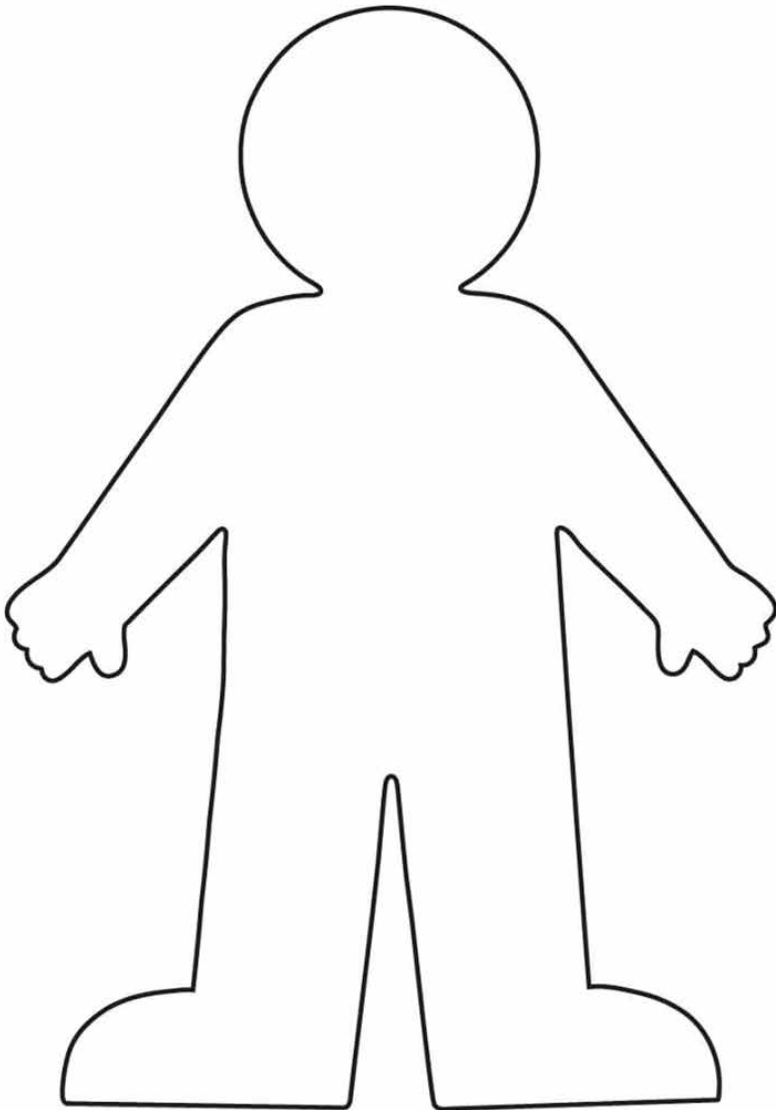
Outdoor PE Kit

House colour and royal blue panelled hooded top with school logo. Royal blue shorts. Royal blue socks. Tracksuit bottoms may be worn as well as school kit, not instead of, and must be black. Football boots should be worn for rugby and football.

In the Summer term, indoor kit shall be worn for outdoor activities.

Attendance and Behaviour

Attendance

At Hesse, high attendance is a priority, and our target is for every student to achieve 96% or better attendance.

We will contact any parent/carer if a student's attendance falls below 96% (this equates to seven days of absence across the whole school year).

Evidence shows that students who have a high attendance record are more successful, not only in school, but in all areas of their life. Regular attendance at school is essential for students' academic achievements and progress. It also helps your social life as well as you maintain regular contact with your friends in school. The routine of daily attendance and punctual arrival is an excellent life skill for students to learn and prepare them for their future careers.

Behaviour

Our school is a calm and welcoming place where students can enjoy their learning and their social time with friends, new and old.

Students behave very well around the school at all times. Students are polite, courteous and respectful of one another. They speak appropriately to each other and to adults in the school. 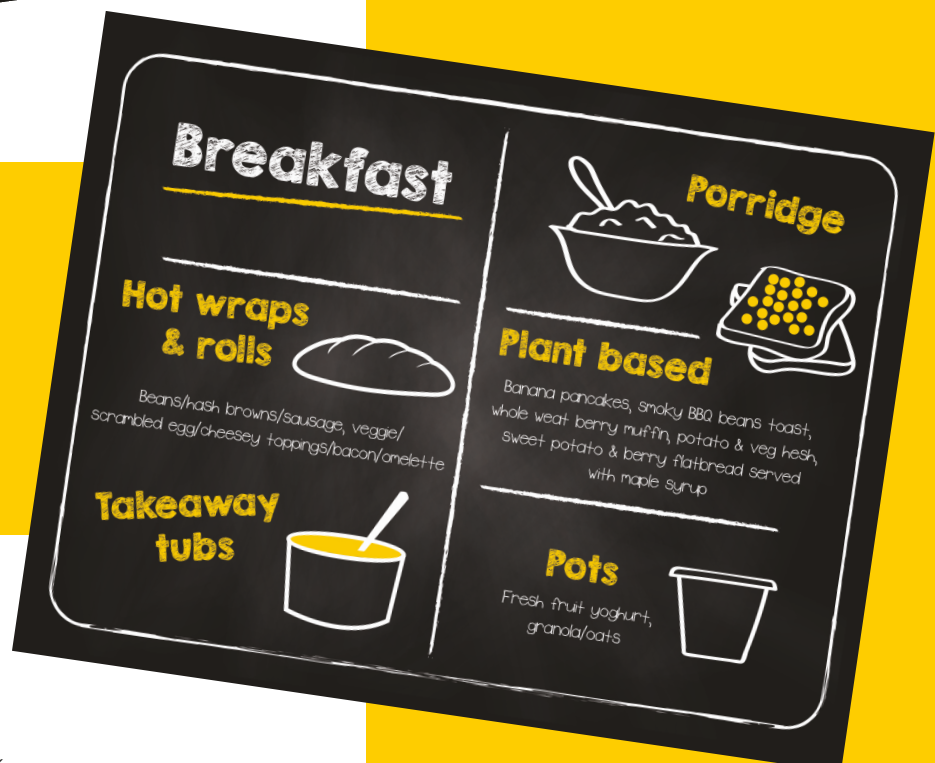
Cashless Catering
